DOGAMI sent a reminder to permittees in their Summer ENGAGe newsletter that permit fees went up starting January 2021 (https://www.oregongeology.org/mlrr/news/ENGAGe_Summer_2021.pdf). They also stated that permit application reviews are delayed due to the volume of submittals they have received. Many state and local agencies appear to be short-staffed for their workloads this year. Timelines for permit review can be delayed several times over if multiple agencies are involved, such as if your DOGAMI permit needs input from DSL, Fish and Wildlife, SHPO, etc. It's always prudent to plan for permitting to take a while, but from recent experience, timelines have been particularly long during the pandemic and could be impacted well into next year. Plan accordingly.

Oregon OSHA launches a free online training course to help comply with the emergency wildfire smoke rule.

Employers now have a free resource to help them comply with rules aimed at protecting workers from wildfire smoke. Oregon OSHA has provided an online training course.

The course “Wildfire Smoke Training Requirements” was designed to help employers meet the training requirements in Oregon OSHA’s emergency temporary rule which addresses wildfire smoke in the workplace.

The temporary rule addressing wildfire smoke took effect on August 9th and will remain in effect for 180 days. The rule required employers to comply with employee training provisions by August 16th. Oregon OSHA encourages a careful reading of the “temporary wildfire smoke rule”. Every workers has the right to a safe and healthy workplace.

Oregon Independent Aggregate Association (OIAA) is proud to offer a \$2,500.00 scholarship to any deserving student pursuing a career related to the construction, aggregate and forestry industry. Areas of study are to include construction, construction management, engineering, geology, architecture, land use planning, forestry, heavy equipment repair and welding.

Who May Apply?

The OIAA Scholarship is open to all current members, employees of current members and their families studying in the required fields as indicated above.

The academic institution may be a university, community college, private college or a trade school with recognized related courses of study. Scholarships will be applied toward full or part-time tuition and or educational material costs within one calendar year.

Your Personal Statement is the most important part of your application! When you prepare your Personal Statement, it's very helpful to tell the OIAA scholarship selection committee about your career goals in the required industries, personal goals, reasons for applying for this particular scholarship, and personal financial circumstances that pertain to your financial need. Your statement should be a minimum of one page and not more than two pages.

The OIAA Selection and Award Process

Applications will be directed to the scholarship selection committee. Scholarship recipient will be notified in writing by the OIAA and the recipient's name will be listed on the OIAA website. Those who do not receive scholarships will also be notified by mail.

Unless otherwise noted, the scholarship shall be in the amount of \$ 2,500.00 as a onetime award.

All recipients will be required to write a short letter of thanks to the OIAA and present it in person at a designated Board Meeting. By attending such meeting you indicate your acceptance of the award and the terms of the scholarship.

Scholarships shall be awarded in compliance with applicable Oregon laws and OIAA policies related to non-discrimination on the basis of sex, race, age, color, national or ethnic origin, marital status, disability, religion, sexual orientation or veteran status.
