#### Chairman's Message

#### Greetings,

As the new chairman of the Oregon Independent Aggregate Association, I would like to thank Erick Staley for his time and efforts as chairman and briefly share about myself. I grew up in Riddle, a small mill and mining town in Southern Douglas County, Oregon. After high school, I attended Oregon State University and earned a bachelor's degree in Forest Engineering. After college, I returned to Douglas County and had a stint in millwork before I went to work as a Forest Engineer for Roseburg Forest Products (Roseburg).

My first years at Roseburg were spent laying out roads, harvest units, and surveying property lines in preparation for logging. I then had the opportunity to work on site design for mill projects, which led to quarry design as well. Currently, I am the Operations Manager for the southern half of Roseburg's Oregon tree farm, overseeing the road construction, harvest unit layout, and quarry and crushing operations.

Roseburg owns a half dozen commercial quarries and forestland-only quarries supporting the management of approximately 400,000 acres in Oregon. Up until 2011 Roseburg operated its own crushers and quarry equipment to produce the aggregate needed for our operations. In 2011 the decision was made to sell the company crushing equipment and contract out our quarry work as a result of increasing liabilities and risk, due in part to the direction MSHA was headed with its penalties and enforcement.

One of Roseburg's core values is safety. Safety is also the purpose of MSHA. "The U.S. Department of Labor's Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) works to prevent death, illness, and injury from mining and promote safe and healthful workplaces for U.S. miners." as shown on the U.S. Department of Labor website



As January is nearing an end, it is the time of year that OIAA begins working on MSHA Part 46 training. MSHA Part 46 regulates the training and retraining of miners as it relates to safety and health. The training applies to miners working at surface mines. See link below for the Part 46 training Reference Guide

Why is Part 46 training important besides the fact that it is required by MSHA? There are inherent dangers in mining and we want all miners to come home from their mine as healthy as when they left their home for work. MSHA lists Metal/Nonmetal Fatalities for 1900 through 2022 at <a href="https://arlweb.msha.gov/stats/centurystats/mnmstats.asp">https://arlweb.msha.gov/stats/centurystats/mnmstats.asp</a> I took that data and graphed the fatalities per thousand miners from 1931 to 2022 (See graph below). The data shows a slight increase in fatalities since 2017. I will not try and speculate why this is, but it does show that there are still clear and present dangers in surface mining and we all should be vigilant in our safety programs.

Please encourage miners that you know or work with to be safe, take the Part 46 training, and join OIAA!
