Chairman's Message

Workplace Examination Update – MSHA announced earlier this month that the effective date for the proposed Workplace Examination rule would be pushed from October 2, 2017 to March 2, 2018. More importantly, MSHA changed some aspects of the rule to be more logical and less of a burden:

- Changing the rule to require "examination of the working place... before work begins or as miners begin work in that place", rather than be required before the start of work. It was left up to miners to figure out how to inspect the workplace before starting work...
- The previous rule called for documentation of all hazards and their resolution. There was concern this would allow for MSHA inspectors to inventory a plethora of safety hazards at a site in one nicely bound package, regardless of impact or severity, including issues that could be quickly resolved on the spot. The revised rule only requires documentation of "adverse conditions that are not corrected promptly and the dates of corrective action for these conditions."

MSHA is holding four stakeholder meetings in late October and early November at locations across the country. The closest meeting to Oregon will be in Salt Lake City on October 26th.
