August 2025

With August coming to an end, we still have a time before those first heavy rains hit Oregon. However, now is the time to be inspecting and fixing any quarry related impoundments. If an issue or failure is discovered during the winter months, it can be hard to adequately and appropriately correct. Conducting regular inspections during the dry months is a good practice. Any issues that are documented can still be minimized or fixed in time for the wet season. Observation, documentation and photographs are a requirement for a DOGAMI/DEQ 1200 permit after a significant rainfall event for most quarries; however, some of the signs of deficiency or failures could be seen during a routine inspection, if qualified personnel are conducting inspections regularly. Look for signs of seepage, erosion, gullying, settlement, etc. Make sure all culverts or channels for water flow are clear of debris and open for winter flows. The risk with delayed or deferred inspection is potential hazards being overlooked and an impoundment losing structural integrity or failing altogether.

Safety Alert

Impoundment Safety After Heavy Precipitation Events

Heavy rainfall and flooding across mining regions can increase the risk of impoundment instability and potential failures. Mine operators and contractors must manage these risks and take proactive steps to ensure the safety of all impoundment structures.

Key Issues:

- Saturation of embankments and foundations can lead to loss of structural integrity.
- Blocked or overwhelmed spillways increase the risk of overtopping.
- Inadequate inspections after weather events delays identification of potential hazards.
- Erosion or seepage along slopes and embankments may go unnoticed.



Best Practices:

- Conduct visual inspections of all impoundments soon after significant rain or snowmelt events.
- Document and photograph all findings, especially signs of erosion, seepage, cracking, or settlement and promptly correct any deficiencies.
- Ensure spillways, drains, and emergency overflow channels are clear and functioning.
- Evaluate freeboard levels and adjust water management practices as needed.
- Notify appropriate personnel and MSHA when hazards are identified.
- Maintain qualified personnel for impoundment inspection and response, on-site or on-call.
- Update your Emergency Action Plan (EAP) and review it with all personnel.

Oregon Independent Aggregate Association (OIAA) is proud to offer a \$2,500.00 scholarship to any deserving student pursuing a career related to the construction, aggregate and forestry industry. Areas of study are to include construction, construction management, engineering, geology, architecture, land use planning, forestry, heavy equipment repair and welding.

Who May Apply?

The OIAA Scholarship is open to all current members, employees of current members and their families studying in the required fields as indicated above.

The academic institution may be a university, community college, private college or a trade school with recognized related courses of study. Scholarships will be applied toward full or part-time tuition and or educational material costs within one calendar year.

Your Personal Statement is the most important part of your application! When you prepare your Personal Statement, it's very helpful to tell the OIAA scholarship selection committee about your career goals in the required industries, personal goals, reasons for applying for this particular scholarship, and personal financial circumstances that pertain to your financial need. Your statement should be a minimum of one page and not more than two pages.

The OIAA Selection and Award Process

Applications will be directed to the scholarship selection committee. Scholarship recipient will be notified in writing by the OIAA and the recipient's name will be listed on the OIAA website. Those who do not receive scholarships will also be notified by mail.

Unless otherwise noted, the scholarship shall be in the amount of \$ 2,500.00 as a onetime award.

All recipients will be required to write a short letter of thanks to the OIAA and present it in person at a designated Board Meeting. By attending such meeting you indicate your acceptance of the award and the terms of the scholarship.

Scholarships shall be awarded in compliance with applicable Oregon laws and OIAA policies related to non-discrimination on the basis of sex, race, age, color, national or ethnic origin, marital status, disability, religion, sexual orientation or veteran status.
