Dear Permittee,

As part of the 2025 legislative session, Oregon Legislature passed SB 836, updating DOGAMI permit fees for all programs to support current services and staff, and establishing additional positions to meet the program's increased workload. It has been 5 years since DOGAMI permit fees were increased, and this legislation modifies the application and renewal fee structure in recognition of increased program costs due to inflation, and adds new staff to perform basic program functions. This will improve our turnaround time for application and permit review, increase our ability to perform routine site inspections, and better meet customer service needs.

This letter is to provide notice that beginning January 1, 2026, increased base and production fees will be assessed with your annual (Operating Permit) renewal. The total amount due is based on whether or not there was activity at your site and how much material was produced by that activity.

A. If there was no extraction activity (production) at your site during the previous 12 months, the total amount due is the base fee of \$2,300.

OR

B. If there was extraction activity (production) at your site during the previous 12 months, your total amount due is a base fee of \$2,300 *plus* \$0.0300/tons of minerals extracted.

Example: A site produces 25,000 tons in a 12-month period.

The base fee for that site is: 25,000 * 0.0300 = \$750The total renewal fee due is: \$3050

Note: the exact calculation for your site will be based on your reported production.

This change in fees will be reflected in your 2026 renewal notice. Instructions for calculating the fee due to DOGAMI will be included in that mailing, and staff will be available by phone and email to assist with any questions about the new fee structure.

The Application Fee for Operating Permits will increase to \$6,500. This includes applications for Operating Permit transfers.

Exploration application fees, DEQ water quality permit application and renewal fees, and transfers of Limited Exemption fees are not included in this change.
